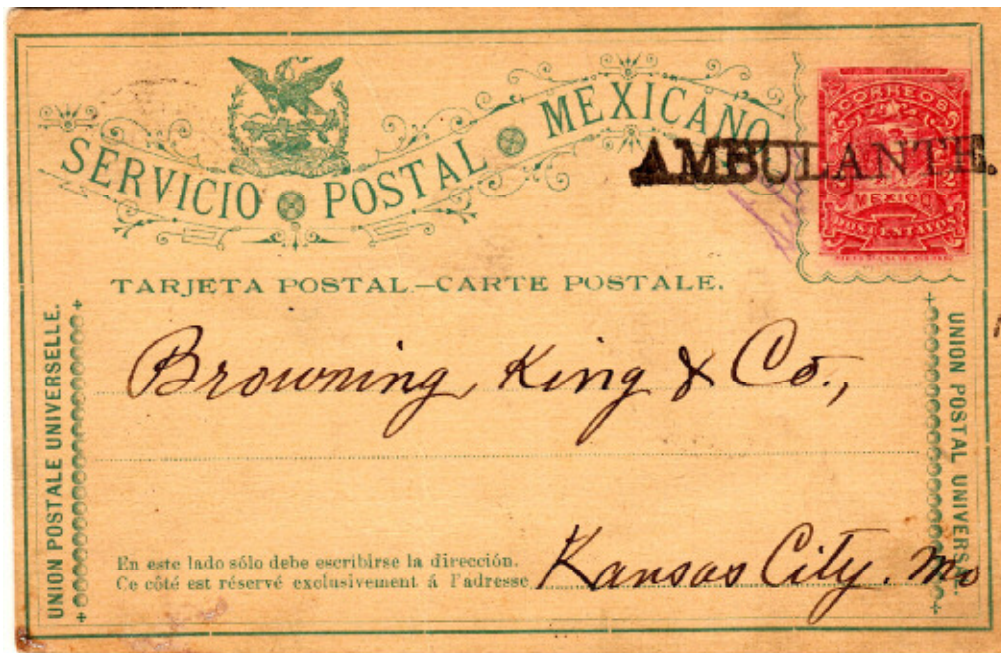


The Travelling Post Offices of Mexico – Second Edition

For the second edition of this book, the first edition has been greatly extended. Much has been discovered, and there are new chapters, a new appendix, and masses more information and data. Whilst inevitably still incomplete, this book now provides a much more comprehensive account of the postal history of the railway travelling post offices of Mexico and of the cancellations used.

The purpose of the study is to list all the known cancellations of the Mexican travelling post offices. From the opening of the first major railway in 1873, Mexico, a very large country, developed an extensive network of railways. Each and every line from the smallest to the largest had its own travelling post office. As comprehensive an account as possible is given of all known cancellations. Background notes are provided on Mexico's history and geography together with information about each railroad. Post Office official information is provided where known. The book is hard bound with a cloth cover; there are 146 pages 270 by 210 mm, and the book is well illustrated, many of the illustrations being in colour.
